MAYORAL COMMENTS:

Honored guests, friends and neighbors -

As we look back at the accomplishments of 2009 and goals of 2010, I want to again thank our volunteers that dedicate their time, energy and efforts to make our community a place that we can be proud of and call home. This reorganization meeting is dedicated to them.

Municipal Building Renovation –

Under the leadership of Council President Gary Quick, we are finally nearing the completion on the municipal Building Renovations. On time and under budget – what more could we ask for. Utilizing the experience and knowledge of the buildings and grounds ad-hoc committee, the tough decisions of the governing body and the work of professionals from the architectural firm of SSP (Scott Mihalik and Tammy) and DEI Enterprises (Dave Tilou and Hank) we have been able to realize an accomplishment that has been many years in the making. I believe that this building will be the cornerstone of our community for many years to come and can't wait for the grand opening in order to share this building with our community and beyond.

Recycling –

Under the leadership of Councilwoman Bross and the Utilities committee, we took a huge step forward in easing the strains of refuse removal and recycling by going to a weekly – curbside, single stream recycling program. No longer is it confusing to remember what days are recycling days and no more storage of recycling products in your garage or storage shed from week to week.

And, in this week's Hunterdon Review – Lebanon Borough leads the county in recycling efforts! I look forward to continued education and success in this and other recycling initiatives.

Historical Committee –

Congratulation to chairman Joe Hauck and the Historical Committee on the February 10th unanimous final vote and approval of the new Lebanon Borough Historic District. Due to these efforts, our community is now listed on both the State and Federal Historic Register.

Shade Tree Committee –

Lebanon Borough was the proud recipient of a 14 foot Liberty Elm donated by the Elm Research Institute. The tree was planted on Arbor Day and dedicated to the late William McIntyre whom was a founding member of the Lebanon Planning Board and a founding member of the Hunterdon County Shade Tree Commission. The tree is planted to the right side of the police/OEM headquarters.

Communications Committee -

Thanks to the members of the communications committee for assisting in the creation of the Lebanon Lantern newsletter. Special thanks go to Councilwoman Schmidt for her uncanny “grammar” lessons performed with her mighty digital pen. We tried some new articles this year with “Front Porch Chat” and “Focus on Business” that spotlighted the Fox and Hound Tavern. We continued with special articles presented by both Hunterdon Medical Center and Edward Jones and hope that you found them to be both informative and relevant. Also of special note is the inclusion of Lebanon Historical Trivia from our Historical Chairman Joe Hauck.

Open Air Market –

A special thanks to Mary Logan and the various volunteers that helped create and man the Spencer-Schneider Open Air Farmers Market. Open every Saturday during the summer, it was a great place to walk to and pick up some fresh produce or baked goods. I have been informed that it will continue again this year.

Planning Board –

The Highlands took much of time and efforts of both the Planning Board this year. Under the direction of Chairman Lex Saharic and our Borough Planner Carl Hintz, Lebanon has made tremendous efforts in completing the current Highlands modules – ALL AT NO COST TO OUR TAXPAYERS! Through the efforts of the Highlands Council, Lebanon Borough has been awarded grant funding for completion of all Highlands modules to date. While there is still much work to do, these modules will give Lebanon Borough officials the information needed to make an informed, educated decision on whether to opt into the Highlands Plan or not.

Lastly, we look forward to the completion of the 150 unit Pizzo and Pizzo project known as Presidential Place along Cokesbury Road and the revision and submission of the Scenic Byway application – which is now called the “Central New Jersey Villages and Vistas Scenic Byway”.

Recreation Commission

Special thanks go to the tireless efforts of the recreation commission in providing fun and traditional events for our residents to enjoy. Some of the more well know events include the town wide yard sale, park School, the traditional tree lighting and the burning of the greens or 12th night which was just held last night in the Holjes-Sheppard Memorial Park.

As Mayor –

I had the good fortune to participate in the walking school bus, a tradition that actually began here in Lebanon Borough through the efforts of Councilwoman Bross and spread throughout the state of

NJ. Another class field trip chaperoning the 6th grade class to Great Adventure - to say it was an adventure would be an understatement. As mayor, I have continued to participate with our local elementary students and teachers to assist with some very worthwhile programs to include both Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies. Each year, the students of Lebanon Borough Elementary School honor our veterans both past and present. I am honored to be a part of such an Endeavour and want to recognize each student for their efforts - but specifically recognize Hayden Coyle who did a research project on the United States Marine Corps. Maybe I am a bit biased on his subject matter -

As Mayor, I have continued my accessibility through the various Mayors open houses and continue to serve at the County level as a member of the Hunterdon County Division of Senior, Veterans and Disability advisory Board and chair of the Legislative Advocacy Committee (LAC). And most recent - I have been elected to serve as Commandant of the local Marine Corps League Detachment.

2010 Goals

Financial –

I believe we should continue our shared vision of fiscal responsibility, regardless of the economic outlook. We should continue to think outside of the box and embrace shared programs when possible. Two such shared programs to be realized in 2010 are DPW work with Tewksbury Township and the new court agreement with Bethlehem Township. The Finance committee has already begun reviewing the 2010 budget and will have more information in the coming month as to when our public budget meetings will occur. We are fortunate to be able to partner with our professionals and announce no increase in contracted rates.

Planning Board -

In the coming months – we will have to make the tough decision to either opt-in or out of the Highlands Plan. I am confident that the Planning Board along with the Governing Body will make an educated/informed decision that will benefit the Borough as a whole.

Heading into my 4th year as Mayor – I continue to be proud to be your Mayor. I am honored to be working with such fine elected volunteers sitting on Council and working with the various boards, committees and commissions. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for the opportunity and privilege to serve as your Mayor – Semper Fi and God bless.

INTEREST ON TAXES

WHEREAS, unpaid taxes result in higher taxes for all, to include most importantly those who pay their taxes on time.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Lebanon that the rate of interest to be charged by the Borough of Lebanon for nonpayment of taxes or assessments on or before the date they would become delinquent shall be eight percent (8%) per annum on the first \$1,500.00 and eighteen percent (18%) per annum on the balance over \$1,500.00 provided, however, that no interest shall be charged if payment of any installment is made within 10 days after the date upon which the same became payable. Any installment received after the expiration of said ten (10) day grace period, shall bear interest from the original due date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there shall be additional penalties for unpaid taxes in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:5-61, namely:

Six percent (6%) penalty on any delinquency exceeding \$10,000.00 on any given parcel of property, where the responsibly party fails to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year.

Any prior resolutions approved inconsistent with the above resolution are hereby repealed.
